Costa Rica is a small country of only 51,000 square kilometers between the Caribbean and the Pacific seas. Although it is a tropical country, during the month of October you will encounter the **rainy season** with frequent rains in the afternoons and temperatures between 26-21°C.

Traveling: You will be arriving at the Juan Santamaría International Airport (SJO) in the outskirts of Alajuela, a few minutes away from the capital. We will coordinate your transportation to Studio Hotel as soon as we receive your travel details. You should look out for REDICA's logo when exiting the Customs area.

Visa requirements are a participant's responsibility but we will be of assistance during that process. We can provide you with official letters and support through the local offices; the average amount of time to get the travel permit is 1 month.
